Suffolk Police campaign to highlight new law around mobile phone use while driving

On 25 March this year it became illegal to use a handheld mobile phone behind the wheel for virtually any use - including to take photos, scroll through playlists or social media accounts and play games. It is also illegal to use a handheld phone or similar device when supervising a learner driver.

These both apply even if you're stopped at traffic lights or queuing in traffic.

Beginning on Monday 2 May and running until Sunday 8 May, Suffolk Police will be raising awareness of the new law through education and enforcement. The minimum penalty if caught driving whilst using a mobile phone is six penalty points and a £200 fine. However, the maximum penalties are a £1,000 fine, six points and a driving ban.
